### What did John Clunies-Ross call the Cocos Islands?

John Clunies-Ross, who sailed there in the Borneo in 1825, called the group the Borneo Coral Isles, restricting Keeling to North Keeling, and calling South Keeling & quot; the Cocos properly so called & quot;. The form Cocos (Keeling) Islands, attested from 1916, was made official by the Cocos Islands Act 1955 (3 & 4 Eliz. 2.

Why are the Cocos Islands called the Keeling Islands?

The territory's dual name (official since the islands' incorporation into Australia in 1955) reflects that the islands have historically been known as either the Cocos Islands or the Keeling Islands. The territory consists of two atolls made up of 27 coral islands, of which only two - West Island and Home Island - are inhabited.

### How many Cocos Islands are there?

The Cocos (Keeling) Islands,or simply "Cocos" to locals,are 27breathtaking islands in an almost perfect circle - only two of which are inhabited. Snorkel,boat,fish,kite surf or dive in the warm,crystal-clear lagoon which forms one of the largest marine sanctuaries in the world.

Who discovered the Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

British sea captain William KEELINGdiscovered the Cocos (Keeling) Islands in 1609, and they were named for their coconut trees in 1622. Some maps began referring to them as the Keeling Islands in 1703. In 1825, Scottish trader John CLUNIES-ROSS was trying to get to Christmas Island but was blown off course and landed on Cocos (Keeling) Islands.

Why should you visit Cocos (Keeling) Islands?

Cocos (Keeling) Islands are a paradise for birdwatchers. The islands are the only land mass in a 900km (559mi) radius, which makes it the perfect place for migratory birds to replenish. The capital of the Territory of Cocos (Keeling) Islands is West Islandwhile the largest settlement is the village of Bantam, on Home Island. Governance of the islands is based on the Cocos (Keeling) Islands Act 1955 and depends heavily on the laws of Australia.
