

What are the ESS safety requirements for energy storage systems?

The International Fire Code (IFC) published its most robust ESS safety requirements in the most recent 2021 edition. By far the most dominant battery type installed in an energy storage system is lithium-ion, which brings with it particular fire risks.

What are the fire and building codes for energy storage systems?

However, many designers and installers, especially those new to energy storage systems, are unfamiliar with the fire and building codes pertaining to battery installations. Another code-making body is the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). Some states adopt the NFPA 1 Fire Code rather than the IFC.

What is the energy capacity of ESS container?

The total energy capacity of the ESS container is 4.29 MWh. This type of BESS container is then typically equipped with smoke detection, fire alarm panel, and some form of fire control and suppression system. Explosion control measures would be required for this type of system which will be explained in detail further down.

What is the NFPA 855 standard for stationary energy storage systems?

Setting up minimum separation from walls, openings, and other structural elements. The National Fire Protection Association NFPA 855 Standard for the Installation of Stationary Energy Storage Systems provides the minimum requirements for mitigating hazards associated with ESS of different battery types.

Does NFPA 855 require explosion control?

NFPA 855 [*footnote 1], the Standard for the Installation of Stationary Energy Storage Systems, calls for explosion control in the form of either explosion prevention in accordance with NFPA 69 [*footnote 2] or deflagration venting in accordance with NFPA 68 [*footnote 3].

Furthermore, more recently the National Fire Protection Association of the US published its own standard for the 'Installation of Stationary Energy Storage Systems', NFPA 855, which specifically references UL 9540A.
