How long do Octopus live in captivity?

Most common octopus species don't live longer than two years. Some, such as the California two-spot octopus, appear to fare relatively well in captivity. Can Octopus live in tanks?

According to a 2019 article on National Geographic's Wildlife Watch, some types of octopuses can do well in tanks, but others struggle. For instance, the California Two-spot Octopus adapts well to captivity, while the Mimic Octopus does not. In general, their health and how long they live in captivity depend on how well they are cared for.

How long do Octopus live after giving birth?

The lifespan of an octopus mostly depends on its species, and not mating doesn't really change how long they live. Octopuses generally live a short time, between six months and a few years. Which octopus has the longest lifespan?
