What is Vatican City known for?

Which Vatican buildings are open to the public?

Of the six entrances, only three--the piazza, the Arco delle Campanie (Arch of the Bells) in the facade of St. Peter's Basilica, and the entrance to the Vatican Museums and Galleries in the north wall--are open to the public. The most imposing building is St. Peter's Basilica, built during the 4th century and rebuilt during the 16th century.

Is Vatican City a World Heritage Site?

As Vatican City is an enclave within Italy, its military defence is provided by the Italian Armed Forces. However, there is no formal defence treaty with Italy, as Vatican City is a neutral state.
